NEW PROGRAMS

TRU Baker Apprenticeship Levels 1-3

- Spring and summer intake. High school graduates welcome. Three levels of technical training are available.

TRU Wildfire: Centre for Wildfire Research, Education, Training and Innovation

- 4 wildfire certificates and 1 diploma for future leaders in wildfire research and management.

Technical Theatre Certificate (12 credits)

- The only one-year program in Western Canada
- Ladders directly into the Bachelor of Arts major in Applied Creative Arts (Theatre) and Theatre minor.

Bachelor of Education Secondary Humanities Pathway

- TRU now offers a Humanities and STEM stream. Admission into the Bachelor of Education Secondary program requires completion of a 4-year bachelor's degree.

Guaranteed Housing

- Students applying directly from high school are guaranteed housing if they apply by **March 31, 2027**. Applications open mid-February.

Application fees reinstated for some programs

- Starting Fall 2027, a application fee of \$34.23 will be charged at the time of application or at time of admission depending on program. Limited seat and competitive programs are charged at time of application through EPBC. For all other programs, an application fee will be charged and deducted from the tuition deposit.

All programs require high school graduation or equivalent.

NON COMPETITIVE DEGREES

Bachelor of Arts

73% in English 12 or English First Peoples 12;
Math 11 (or higher) recommended for students pursuing Education
or a major in Geography and Environmental Studies, Sociology,
or Psychology.

Bachelor of Business Administration

73% in English 12 or English First Peoples 12;
67% in Foundations of Math 12 or Pre-Calculus 12

Bachelor of Communication and Digital Journalism

73% in English 12 or English First Peoples 12

Bachelor of Computing Science

73% in English 12 or English First Peoples 12;
67% in Foundations of Math 12 or Pre-Calculus 12

Bachelor of Science

73% in English 12 or English First Peoples 12;
Chemistry 11; 67% in Pre-Calculus 12; Physics 11;
67% in Life Sciences 11 or Anatomy and Physiology 12
(for some majors)

International Baccalaureate (IB) The IB Diploma Programme (DP) and Career-related Programme (CP) may be used to meet TRU's general admission requirements. English and program-specific requirements still apply.

Advanced Credit: Students may also earn first year academic credit. tru.c.ca/asep
