for supporting Sexualized Violence Prevention and Response work

Violence prevention takes community effort.

Sexualized Violence Prevention and Response (SVPR) work is most effective when done in community. There are roles and actions everyone can take.

As Faculty, you can do the following:

- Complete the one-hour [Staff and Faculty Training on Deltek](#)
- Familiarize yourself with the Sexualized Violence Policy (BRD 25-0)
- Familiarize yourself with supports available through the SVPR Office
- Lead by example in meetings and interactions with colleagues - share what you have learned and encourage others to engage with the work
- Share the SVPR provided [slides](#) at the beginning of your course
- Encourage your students to complete the [Sexualized Violence training on Moodle](#). Better yet, incentivize it for them with a bonus mark! Please note the passkey is "SVPR".
- Remind students of available supports half way through the semester
- Avoid prying and trust that your colleagues in the SVPR Office are doing their jobs thoughtfully and thoroughly if you receive a letter requesting flexibility in course deliverables for a survivor.
- Know that you don't have to get it perfect and commit to ongoing learning: attend SVPR events and trainings, read about or listen to the experiences and needs of diverse folks
