Safer Campuses for Everyone is a **Moodle course** that explores the meaning and impact of sexual violence and examines why sexual violence happens. Participants will learn about the importance of consent in all relationships and how to intervene to prevent sexual violence. Students who self-enroll in this 60-90 minute training will receive a certificate upon completion.
