Apply online at truworld.ca/apply
Upload required documents (transcripts, language proficiency, etc.). Application fee: \$100 CAD.
- 3 ACCEPTANCE**
Receive a Conditional Letter of Acceptance (CLOA) within 10-15 business days (undergrad) or 4-6 weeks (grad).
- 4 PAYMENT**
Pay tuition deposits through PayMy Tuition by bank transfer, debit, or credit card at tru.ca/pay
- 5 OFFICIAL ACCEPTANCE**
Receive your Official Letter of Acceptance (LOA). TRU obtains your Provincial Attestation Letter (PAL) on your behalf (if applicable).
- 6 STUDY PERMIT**
Apply for your study permit with your LOA and PAL using BorderPass at TRU.

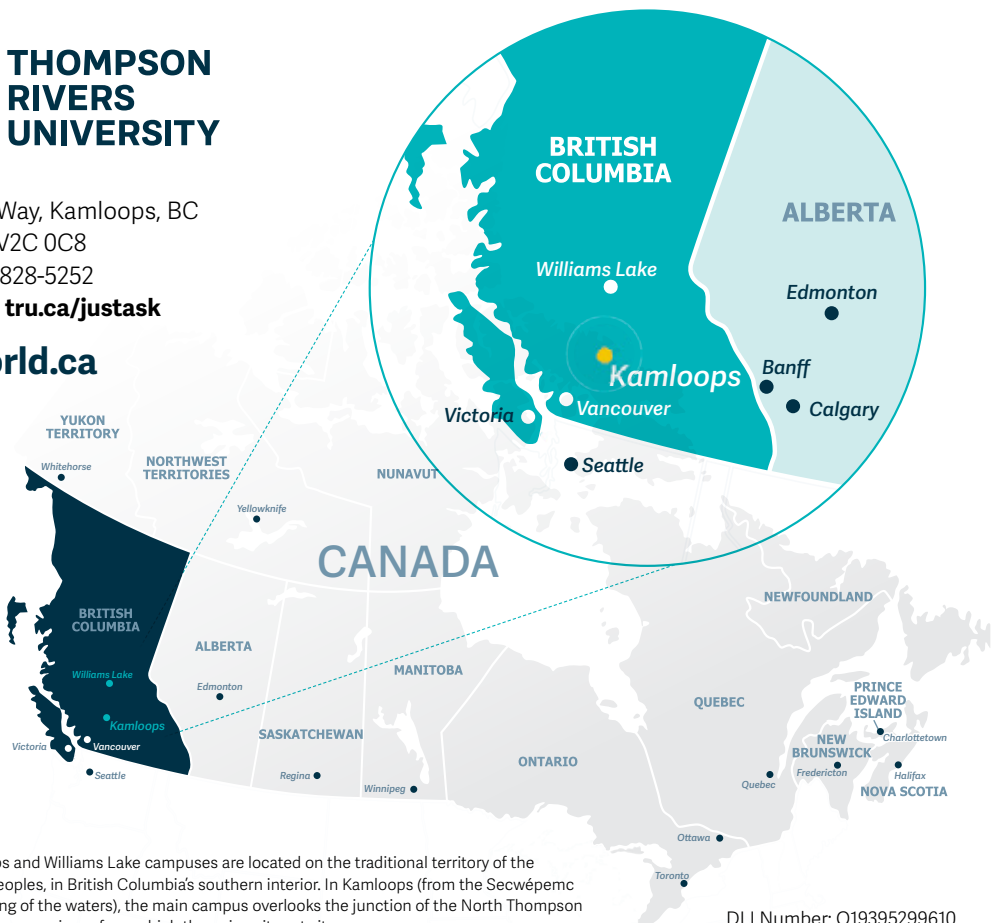
